## Responsibility

## Privacy

- Keep passwords secret

- Don't share your location

## Stranger Danger

- People online are not always who they say they are
- Tell a friend or family member where you're going before meeting people from the internet, and only meet in public places
- Don't share your address online

## The Law

- College internet use is monitored
- Online actions may have serious offline consequences
- It's a criminal offense to send threatening messages online
- It's illegal to 'sext' if you're under 18

## Respect

- Think before you share online, once it becomes public it can be difficult or even impossible to delete
- Don't use technology to be unkind to people or say anything you wouldn't offline
