AS Level

Course Overview:

Sociology is an illuminating field of study that sheds light on a number of important matters within our personal lives, communities, and the world. Within the AS-Level, you will examine societal development in relation to our cultures. identities, and familial roles, as well as explore sociological research skills linked to social inequality. The A-Level dissects social inequality in more depth, discussing different ideas about inequality and power, particularly concerning education. Throughout the course, you will also be introduced to several global debates as you study globalisation and the digital world.

Course Assessment:

AS-Level

At AS-Level, you will be assessed by two end-of-year exams.

A-Level

At A-Level, you will be assessed by three end-of-year exams.

Course Prospects:

A qualification in Sociology is very beneficial. It can help lead you to several different university courses. Some examples of university courses that Sociology students go on to study are Sociology, Criminology, Social Policy, International Relations, Psychology, Law, Business Studies, and Film Studies. We always recommend checking the UCAS website to see if any other A-Levels will be required to do the course that you want to do.

Sociology can also be an advantageous qualification to have in a multitude of different career paths such as marketing, law, teaching, Civil Service, and social work.
